

Ehsan Khatibi

Biography

Ehsan Khatibi was born in 1979 in Tehran. He began his first music theory and composition studies with Alireza Mashayekhi (Iranian musician, composer and conductor) in Tehran, where he at the same time learned piano (with Farman Behboud and Tamara Dolidze) and also santur (an Iranian instrument with Mohamadreza Fayaz).

After studying composition at "Tehran University of Art", in 2008 he started to study composition with Manfred Trojahn and also music theory with Frank Zabel, at "Robert Schumann Hochschule" in Düsseldorf. He has successfully completed his studies at 2013 and 2014.

He is the founder and former conductor of the "Iranian Ensemble for New Music", which won the first prize in the "Competition for New Music" at Tehran University in 2006.

As a composer he is a scholarship holder of the "RSH/DAAD" in 2012/2013 as well as the "INMM-Darmstadt" in 2013/2014. He has also won the third award of the "International Composer Competition, Croatia (New Note) for his work "Tensus" in 2012.

Ehsan Khatibi currently studies Master of Composition at "Universität der Künste Berlin" with Elena Mendoza and at the same time teaches music theory at "Robert Schumann Hochschule" in Düsseldorf.
